THE POST OFFICE DEPT. expects this Christmas Season to be the largest in history, and Postmaster Jennings urges every one to mail their packages early to insure their safe arrival by Dec. 25th. The use of First Class Mail for Christmas cards is recommended, as they receive preferential handling, may be sealed, may contain writing and will be forwarded or returned if undeliverable.

The Mail Truck Routes serving Van Nuys, Reseda, Canoga Park, etc. have recently been extended to Chatsworth, and we now have the advantage of more incoming mail deliveries, and more dispatches daily, which clears all mail and shortens the time of delivery to all offices. Also, a later time of 5:45 P.M. instead of 4:30 p.m. has been established for the evening dispatch.

The Post Office Dept. has established permanent Postal boundaries between Granada Hills, Northridge, Chatsworth and Canoga Park, effective January 1, 1956, before more housing and other development complicates the procedure. Several areas of overlapping delivery from two Post Offices were delineated, and the establishment of a uniform north-south boundary through the Valley was made by designating Cobin Avenue as the boundary.

Roger and Patti are native Californians and they met at USC where her father, Marc Goodnow (who lives with them) was Professor of Journalism for thirty years. They majored in art, Patti with a BFA and Roger with an AB degree.

Roger furthered his studies at Chouinard Institute of Art, gaining practical experience at Paramount Pictures; then after his war service affiliating himself with the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor as a teacher of art.

Then during the summer of 1948 they vacationed in Southern California where he taught at Jepson Art Institute. As the fall term approached he cancelled his contract at Michigan to stay on with Jepson and had taught three weeks when polio struck him down.

He lived in an iron respirator for one year at General Hospital and when released from Rancho Los Amigos in Norwalk, after a total of 23 months, they came to Chatsworth, 20917 Devonshire, with Dad coming out with them to help take over.

It has been an uphill job for everyone in the family, but nary a

woeful note from any of them. Roger's legs are completely immobile, and gradually he has gained more and more strength in his arms and shoulders through exercise and encouragement.

He again resumed the art work that had been started and laid aside and today one will find him in his own private studio away from the house (built by Lynn Burgett and finished about a month ago), in his wheelchair, busily manipulating the printing machine made by handicapped people for handicapped people.

For the Golden Jubilee celebration of USC this past month, the alumni of the College of Arts were asked to exhibit their workmanship and Roger submitted a serigraph (silk-screen painting) entitled "E is for Elephant".

He is a member of the Western Serigraph Institute of So. Calif. and among the forty members, six live here in Chatsworth: the President, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Worthley, Mr. and Mrs. Guy Maccoy, Lee Purcell and Roger. They met at Jepson Art and have encouraged one another throughout these many years, with Guy Maccoy pioneering in the silk-screen field.

They have four lovely, talented children and Roger has nothing but praise for everyone who has come within their sphere and helped to make the way a little brighter. He lauds the rehabilitation program of the polio crusade for the promotion of creative work on the part of the afflicted. To meet a man who at one time would rather have given up than struggle on, and now to see him busily engaged in bringing out his personality, is to be challenged-inspi
