Civic Improvements

Because of the emphatic stand that our Chamber of Commerce took on the siege of burglaries in February, the L.A. Police Dept. have increased their Valley staff and Chatsworth is being patrolled a little better than it was for many months and years previously. It could stand improvement, inasmuch as Chatsworth Market was again entered into last Friday night, but a forward step has been taken in our interests.

The Bureau of Lighting for the City of L.A. has concurred with the request of our Chamber to install street lights at the intersections of Topanga and Nordhoff, and also at Nordhoff and Canoga, and said installations should be in effect soon.

The S. P. Railroad are apparently to be congratulated on installing that tremendously bright light over the tracks on Chatsworth Street, which is indeed a safety factor.

trian crosswalks at school bus stops: Owensmouth and Devonshire; Lassen and Topanga; Nordhoff and Topanga; DeSoto and Devonshire; and the repainting of the crosswalks at our school. We trust they won't take too long at this.

Another matter on the agenda of the Chamber of Commerce is the reducing of the existing speed limits on U.S. State Highways #27 (Topanga) and #118 (Devonshire and Santa Susana) particularly as traffic comes into our business section. Because of additional business houses on both sides of each highway, there is considerably more foot traffic, especially among the children, and so oncoming traffic should be forewarned by signs to slow down as they approach the congested areas.

The City of L.A. Fire Commission has been authorized to purchase a parcel of land somewhere in the vicinity of Topanga and Plummer for the installation of a fire station to serve Chatsworth. Its construction is scheduled to begin in the summer of 1957 and will be in full operation toward the end of that year. As our fair city grows, another fire station is slated for the vicinity of Corbin and Devonshire, but that will be four or five years hence.
