



The other day when Rocketdyne showed newsmen its super-secret Propulsion Field Laboratory in Santa Susana Mountains, virtually all of the nations leading newspapers and magazines were represented—and so was the smallest newspaper, the Chatsworth Grapevine.

Its reporter was Robert P. Boggis, and it was his first newspaper assignment.

He clutched his parcel of handouts and wore his plastic safety beenie with the same dignity and aplomb as the rest of us.

He visited with local members of the press and the boys from the east and midwest as we trudged up and down hills and climbed in and out of the buses getting over the ground.

NOW THE Chatsworth Grapevine—Page size 6 by 9 inches—is published by two young ladies, Mrs. Viola Haskell and Mrs. Betty Straka.

Rockets and such mysterious things are normally not part of the paper's news content. It deals with the

doings of church groups, Cub Packs, Chamber of Commerce reports and the like, and it comes out once a week.

But here was a big event in its own back yard, and this was going to be covered. The readers wanted to know what made all the noise.

Boggis, a resident of Chatsworth for the last 10 years— ("Came out here on a trip and couldn't go back to Ohio because of gas rationing, so I stayed.")—is a retired manufacturer of metal objects.

He was a natural to send on the story as a special correspondent.

FROM THE day of the first rumbles that something was afoot in the hills, Boggs has been curious about the operations. He and others watched the roads being built, including the road one of the engineers said "We like to call our access road."

He heard trucks laden with materials for the installations groan as they climbed to the site during the construction period.

Because of his interest in things metallurgical he has kept abreast of developments, including the missile field.

There were aviation and

science editors and reporters and country newspaper editors and magazine staffers along on the trip.

Many of these have covered the major stories in the missile field.

BUT, IT'S possible that one of the best informed reporters on the scene the other day—certainly for the story involved—was Boggis, there for the smallest newspaper.

Well, folks, we're not so small but what we can be noticed!
