It certainly pays to over-see. There are 26 mountains in Colorado higher than Pike's Peak!



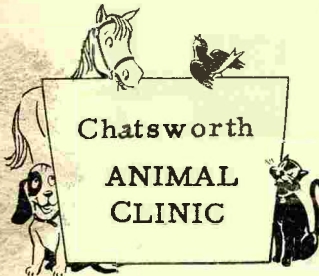
time you can spare will be more than appreciated.
