WHEREAS, the basic need in our nation today is the preservation of Constitutional Government; and WHEREAS, in order to protect our priceless heritage under our unique form of government, it is essential to support our Constitution, and WHEREAS, for its proper support, it is necessary that our citizens understand its provisions and principals and appreciate its values and benefits as "The greatest document for human liberty in two thousand years of recorded history" and WHEREAS, the Daughters of the American Revolution are sponsoring the observance of Constitution Week, September 17-23, 1956, in commemoration of the 169th Anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Roy Rogers, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Honorary Mayor of the City of Chatsworth in the state of California do hereby proclaim the week of September 17-23, 1956, as
CONSTITUTION WEEK
in the city of Chatsworth, and urge all our citizens to pay special attention during the week to our Federal Constitution and the advantages of American Citizenship, honoring the United States Flag and especially emphasizing the purposes of Good Government as set forth in the Preamble of our Constitution, and the duty of all persons in our Republic to protect our Constitution and our Bill of Rights, so it may continue to protect us, and our posterity in "This Nation under God".

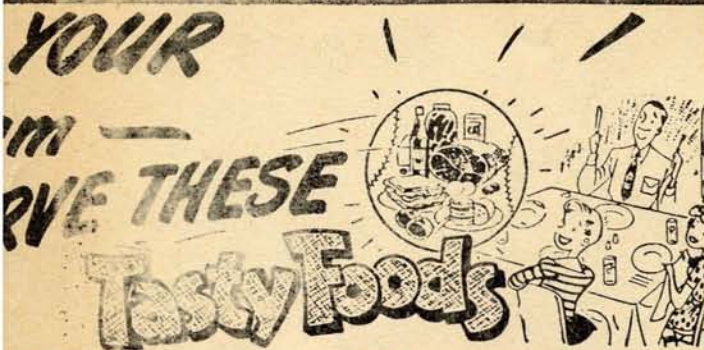
