

Linda had five stitches taken in her right arm and 32 stitches in her left arm, and as we go to press there is a great possibility that much surgery must be performed. Because of David's quick action and level thinking, the doctor reports that her life was saved -- she would have bled to death before aid arrived 30 minutes later.


