Auxiliary Christmas Plans

Members of the Chatsworth American Legion Auxiliary are putting in many hours work on the Gift Shop program of the 20th District for the hospitalized veterans, and has purchased gifts to the value of \$150 for the shop. Gifts are provided by Units throughout the District and taken to the hospital. Bed-ridden patients have the store brought to them on wheels, where they may select gifts for their entire family. Unit members later gift-wrap them and also wrap them for mailing. They are then addressed and sent to their families.

The personalized gift program follows, when gifts for the veterans themselves are collected from any interested organization. The Federated Woman's Clubs have taken charge of the re-wrapping of gifts mailed to patients after they have been checked for safety.

The Unit will also fill baskets with Christmas sweets for the 34 men in their adopted ward at the San Fernando Veteran's Hospital. Mrs. Louise Hillman, re-hab chairman, is in charge of this activity. The Unit will also give valuable help as usual to the annual

children's community Christmas Party sponsored by the Chatsworth American Legion.

The Unit is proud to have as one of its members Mrs. Virginia Somerville, who is the Department Hospital Representative of the Sepulveda Veteran's Hospital. She is assisted by Betty Holman of Panorama City as alternate representative.

Mrs. Somerville is spending as many as 14 hours a day, 2 or 3 times a week, on the Christmas program for the hospital and her other duties there. She is asking for old nylon stockings to make stuffed toys, old scrap lumber that can be used to make small toys, and scrap candles that can be used in making attractive candles for Christmas and other occasions. This is a part of the occupational therapy work of the hospital.

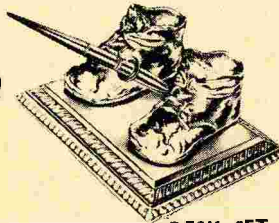

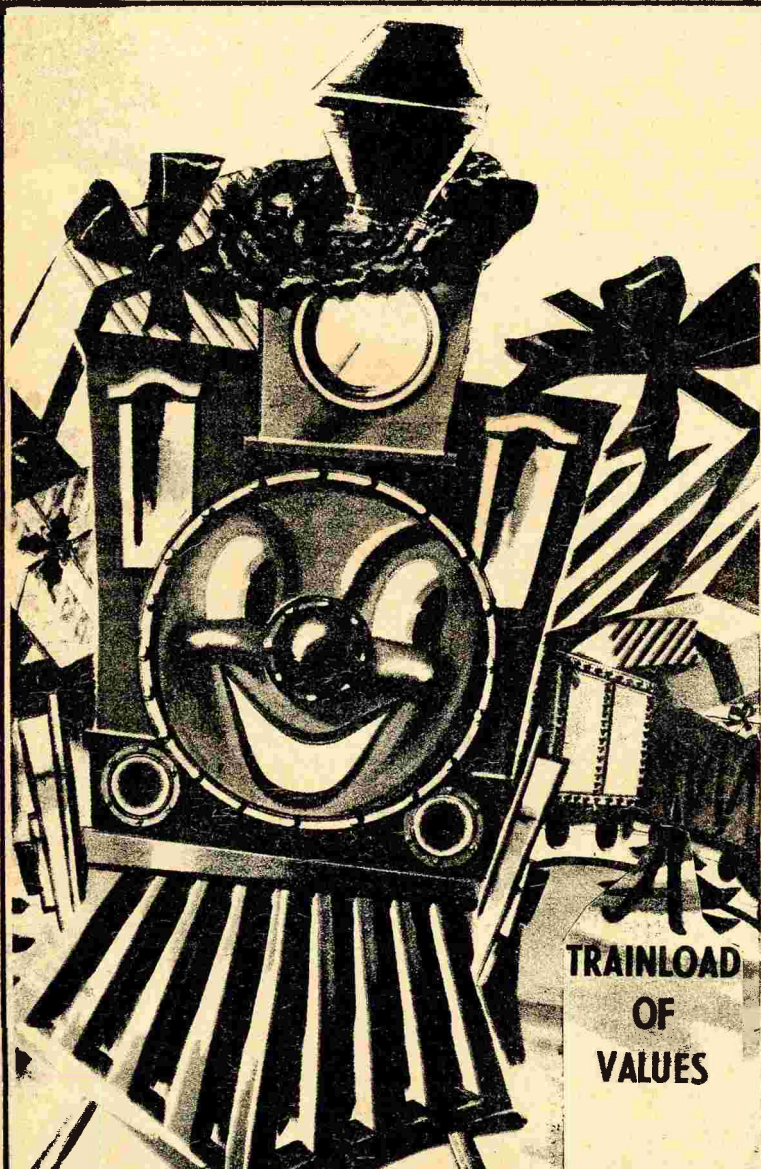
