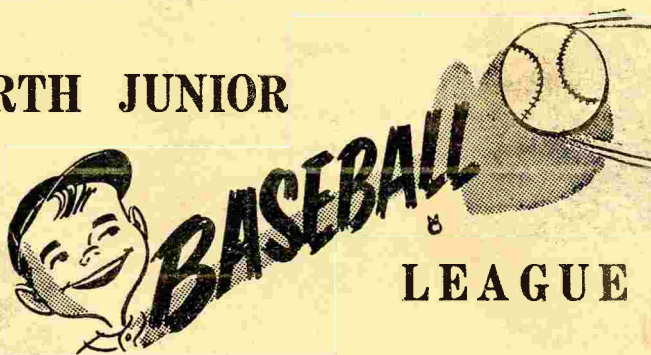

## Installation Meeting

The hall of Chatsworth Center was filled to capacity for the annual dinner and installation of officers of the Chatsworth Chamber of Commerce Tuesday, Jan. 8. Chef Mike Roy and his helpers served the dinner which consisted of a tossed green salad, prime ribs of beef, potatoes au gratin, string beans, rolls, watermelon pickles, apple pie, and coffee.

A large bouquet of giant white mums centered the head table, and smaller bouquets of smaller white mums, with a lighted green candle in the center, graced the other tables. The flowers were furnished by Chatsworth Florist.

The president, Charles Janess, led in the allegiance to the flag, and then presented Dr. Harold Hayward, who gave the invocation.

At the conclusion of the dinner, Mr. Janess gave a short talk in which he briefly summarized the activities of the Chamber the past year. He stressed the major accomplishment -- the

forming of the Chatsworth Youth Foundation which grew out of the July 4th Fiesta, and which has recently become incorporated to better carry on its work. He expressed his sincere appreciation to the board, the City Hall, and the Mayor's office for their cooperation. He then presented the honorary Sheriff, Jack O'Shea, the Master of Ceremonies. Mr. O'Shea presented as the first number on the program, the Four Whip-or-Wills, who entertained with a group of numbers and then called on the Honorary Mayor Roy Rogers to join in a song with them. It came out that the group had sung together three or four years ago, so Roy agreed to "practice" with them, but to all the listeners the clever yodelling number was a finished performance. Roy then called upon "mother", namely, his wife Dale Evans, to come and sing, and she too, graciously agreed. She sang "Over the Rainbow" with a sacred parody of her own composition. 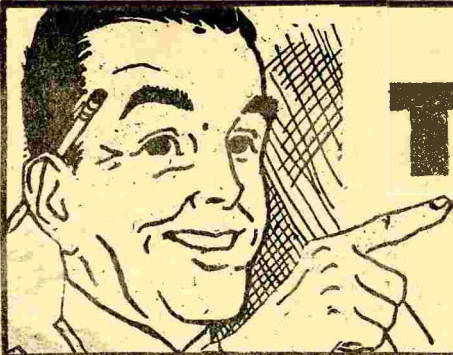
