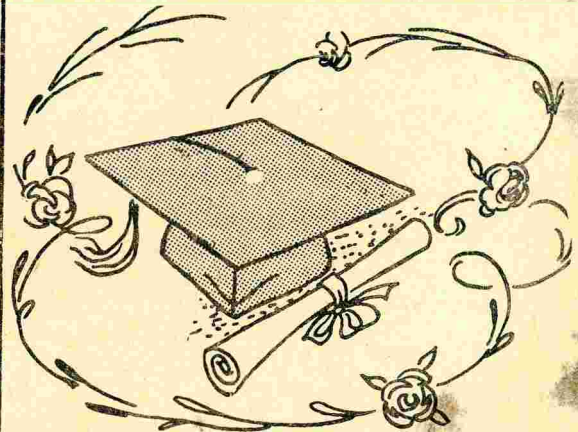

Store must not be opened on the Sabbath unless necessary to do, and then only for a few minutes. The employee who is in the habit of smoking Spanish cigars, being shaved at the barber shop, going to dances and other places of amusement, will surely give his employer reason to be suspicious of his integrity and honesty. Each employee must pay not less than \$5 per yr. to the church and must attend Sunday School regularly. Men employees are given one even-

ing a week for courting and 2 if they go to prayer (see pg.12)
