Proposed Schools

A resume of the Chatsworth Chamber of Commerce meeting could not be printed last week due to our deadline, so some gleanings of information will be passed on to you now.

Mrs. LaVerne Lee, our elementary school Principal, as the first speaker told of various new schools that will soon be built in and near our area here. Of immediate importance is the remodelling of the present school at Topanga and Devonshire to make more room, which may start at any time. We'll miss some of the trees that must come out, but our children's education comes first! There should be a new school near Roscoe and Shoup to serve the Cinderella tract by September, thereby relieving pressure here, one at Plummer and Oso for the new Aldon tract, and a Jr. High north of Sutter and east of DeSoto. Then by September of 1958 we should have a South Chatsworth School in the vicinity of Topanga and Plummer. Mrs. Lee stressed her hope that Chatsworth can keep its beauty, charm, and friendliness along with the rapid growth and changing times.

Mr. Marion Sparrow of the Dept. of Parks informed those present of appropriations promised if the bond issue on the May 28 ballot passes. Chatsworth is scheduled to receive for a park \$475,000, to be used here in our immediate com-

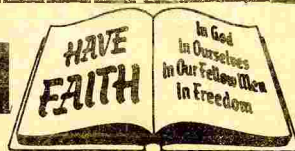
American Legion will be on the streets Friday and Saturday, May 24 and 25.

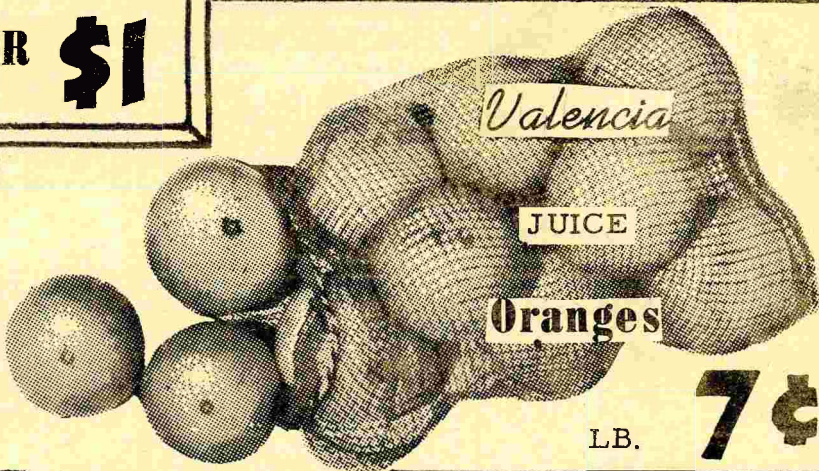

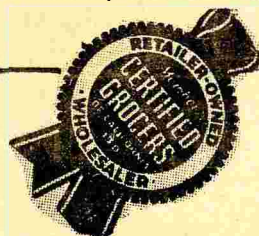
