Her American foster mother, Mrs. Willis Hindman of Woodland Hills, was also a special guest of the club.

Mrs. Kate Sheridan, President, conducted a brief business meeting, and a report of the State Convention in San Diego was given by Mrs. Arthur Young. 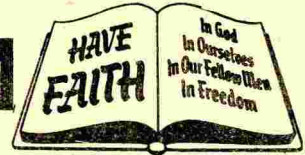

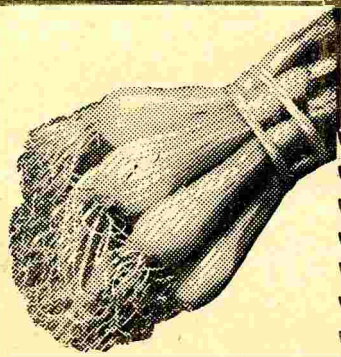

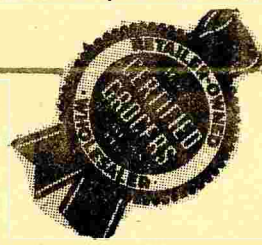
