At Rest

Funeral services were held a week ago Saturday for two former Chatsworth young men who grew up here and attended the local school and Canoga High. The two families lived across the street from each

other for many years.

Richard Swartz, 29, passed away Tuesday, July 30, at the Sepulveda Hospital where he had been brought just eleven days previous, from the Long Beach Naval Hospital where he had been under observation and care for a lingering illness for the past year. Funeral services were held from the Pierce Brothers Mortuary, with Rev. Dale Conrad of the Crescent Heights Methodist Church officiating and Russell Horton singing selected songs. Interment was in Oakwood Memorial Park.

Dick was born on April 1, 1928, in Venice but had lived in Chatsworth since he was two years old, until his marriage a few years ago when he went to live in Van Nuys. He joined the Community Methodist Church when a young boy and has maintained his membership there. After his graduation from Canoga Park High School, he joined the Navy and served there for four years. He is survived by his wife Jean, two daughters, Nancy and Kathy; his father, Lester: three brothers, twin Bob, Gene and Clifford; and two sisters,

Elaine and Mrs. Lila Schepler; and by a host of friends whose presence at the services and whose beautiful floral tributes were a token of the esteem and friendship in which he was held.

Funeral services for Jack
Swearinger, 22, were held at
Oakwood Chapel with Rev. Carl
E. Burns of the Chatswith Four
Square Church officiating. Jack
was tragically killed in an automobile collision at the corner of
Reseda Boulevard and Devonshire
Boulevard late at night August 1
when he was thrown from the car.

Jack was born in Ventura on April 28, 1935, but came to Chatsworth when a small boy. He made his home here until his marriage two years ago. He was working at Rocketdyne and living in Northridge at the time of his death.

He is survived by his wife, Jacqueline, and an infant daughter Naray; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Swearingen, who recently moved to Huntirgton Beach, and a sister and brother. Many, many friends join the family in mourning his unimely passing.
