Rod McKenzie, general manager, stated that 48 games had been played, and seven dozen bats and 150 balls had been used. He gave an account of funds that proved most interesting: Received from the radio sale was \$40; profit from the refreshment stand was \$521.50; fence ads, \$390; sale of team picture, \$23; collections \$412.45; and donation of uniforms, \$1,658---a total of \$3,644.95 received. Total expenses were \$2,386.29, leaving a balance of \$658.66 to begin next year's season.

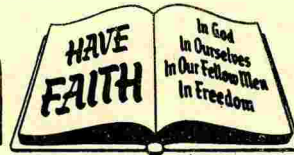
He left before the semester actually begins as he is going out for football, and is a guest of Phi Sigma Kappa for these two weeks.
