Muscular Dystrophy March

Mrs. Keith Andes, wife of motion picture, TV, and stage star Keith Andes (who by the way prefers living western-style in Chatsworth to filmland's social whirl), has been named to act as Chairman for the 1957 March for Muscular Dystrophy locally.

The Andes have been residents of Chatsworth for the past six years with their sons Mark and Matthew. Mrs. Andes is a former Powers model, and during World War II she served as a combat nurse for the American Forces in the Italy Theater of Action.

The March for Muscular Dystrophy will take place on December 3 when volunteers will go out to collect funds to aid muscular dystrophy victims, of which there are more than 200,000 in the nation today. 135,000 of these are children in whom the disease is always fatal.

"This will be our first organized March for Muscular Dystrophy in Chatsworth and I am urging all residents of our community to join with me in helping make it a successful one," Mrs. Andes pointed out. She is organizing a posse of riders to cover our area on the day of the "March", and plans are for the riders to start out at 9:00 a.m. -- cover all the ranches and homes, and then rendezvous at the Andes Ranch to turn in the marcher kits and have luncheon.

Cheese You Can Freeze

The freezer temperature should be 0°F. or lower, and the piece of cheese should weigh no more than one pound. This is because larger pieces—for example, a five-pound wedge—become chalky in appearance when frozen, and when thawed, become crumbly. The theory is that large crystals of ice form during slow freezing and break up the curd.

Varieties of cheese that will successfully freeze and keep in freezer storage for six months include Cheddar, Brick, Swiss, Port Salut, Provölone, Mozzarella, Casu Marzu, Parmesan and Romano.

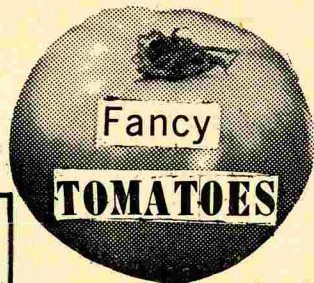
