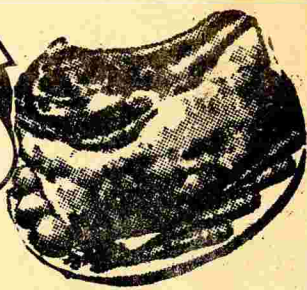

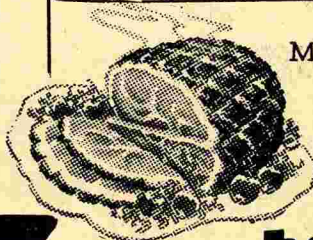

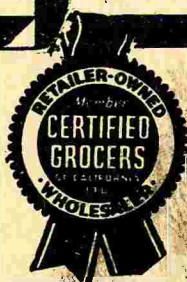

When one of the pollsters sent his people out to ask the public if they believed in God he found that only a very small percentage are unbelievers. Just about everyone said that they believed in God. But their so-called "belief" is more of an acceptance of an idea than a personal experience. It is like saying you believe that Toscanini is a great musician though you know nothing of his genius. Or, that Rembrandt was a great artist though you know nothing of his work. Or that Milton was a great writer though you haven't read one of his sonnets. So do people say, "Sure, I believe in God."

But that isn't enough. God is not an idea you accept. He is a Person whom you may experience. Faith is more than a form to be followed, and Christianity is more than a catechism to be learned. It is to experience a new birth into a new life so that you will say, "It is no longer I that live, but Christ liveth in me." This is going beyond belief when your religious experience is no longer just an idea but a soul-stirring experience.

The objective of the Rotary Foundation is the fostering of projects to promote understanding and friendly relations between the peoples of different nations. Its major activity is granting Rotary Foundation Fellowships to outstanding graduate students for one year study abroad as Rotary ambassadors of good will.

For the 1957-58 school year, 130 outstanding graduate students from 31 countries are attending universities in countries other than their own as Rotary Foundation Fellows, serving as Rotary ambassadors of good will. Since this program was established in 1947 953 young men and women from 61 countries have received Rotary fellowships for study.
