DR. NEWLAND, Chatsworth's Veterinarian, has just returned from Washington, D.C., where he attended a two-week medical symposium on Medical Effects of Special Weapons at the National Naval Medical Center at Bethesda, Maryland.

Doctors, Dentists, Veterinarians, Nurses, and other medical specialists of the Ready Reserve of Army, Navy and Air Force were equally represented and came from 37 states, Puerto Rico, and Hawaii. Following is a synopsis by Dr. Newland of this interesting two weeks:

"Our country's potential enemy using the combined effects of nuclear, biological and chemical warfare now available, could wipe out more than half our population of 173,000,000 in the first attack. We need not kid ourselves, we are target No. 1. There is much that could be done to reduce this high initial casualty loss and it must be done by each and every individu-

al through study, training, drill, and full cooperation with the civil defense. One of the prime needs is for everyone to know and be able to use good first aid. Russian school children have completed the advanced first aid course by the time they are in the 6th grade. We must start teaching it in all our schools immediately to everyone and start children in the primary grades. It is everyone's right and duty to know the Civil Defense plan in their area and to participate in exercises. There will be survivors and it will be their privilege to care for the casualties, living and dead. The more we know about survival, the better our chances are individually."

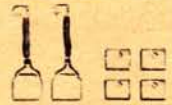

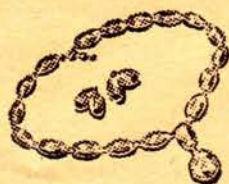

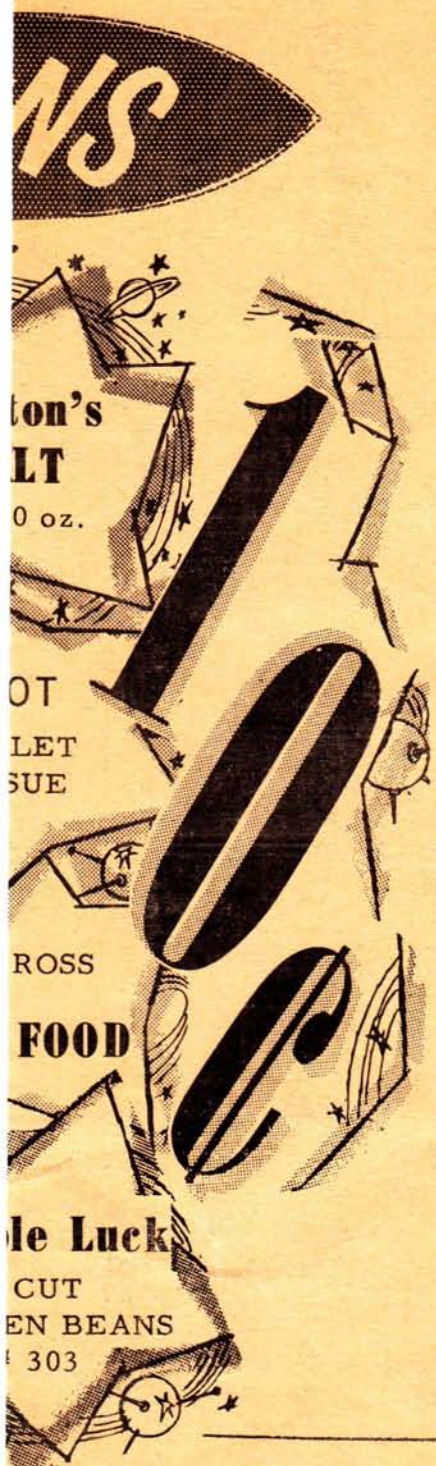
