narian, has just returned from Washington, D.C., where he attended a two-week medical symposium on Medical Effects of Special Weapons at the National Naval Medical Center at Bethesda, Maryland.

We need not kid ourselves, we are target No. 1. There is much that could be done to reduce this high initial casualty loss and it must be done by each and every individu-

Russian school children have completed the advanced first aid course by the time they are in the 6th grade. It is everyone's right and duty to know the Civil Defense plan in their area and to participate in exercises. There will be survivors and it will be their privilege to care for the casualties, living and dead. The more we know about survival, the better our chances are individually." 
