





Word has been received of the death of JOHN W. FLINT of Yuba City, a former Chatsworth resident, who passed away with a heart attach on Saturday, May 31. Mr. Flint had had several attacks in recent years, but apparently was much improved lately. Funeral services were held Thursday, June 5, from the Presbyterian Church in Marysville. Mr. Flint was stricken while en route to visit a real estate client. He was found in his car which was driven to the side of the road, indicating he felt the attack coming.

Mr. Flint was manager of the Chatsworth plant of the Armacost Nursery for many years. He was always vitally interested in the civic welfare of the community and was an active member of the First Methodist Church, where he was the choir director and served in many other official capacities.


