Tragic Death

Just last March we printed the news of the marriage of Kent Robert Fitzgerald, son of Virginia Lynn of Chatsworth Art Studio, to Patsy Elaine Price. Now, much to our regret, we must print the news of his death.

Perhaps you read in the metropolitan newspapers of the tragic head-on crash last Wednesday on the freeway. Kent was one of the Navy boys who lost his life. He was stationed at Camp Pendleton.

Besides leaving his wife, Patsy Elaine, he leaves two brothers, Darryl and Lynn, and a sister Marlinda, his mother, Virginia Lynn of Chatsworth, and his father in Burbank, Gerald Fitzgerald and stepmother Mildred Fitzgerald; a grandmother, Mrs. Alice Milligan and devoted aunt, Helen Beck.

Kent was deeply loved by his many friends and buddies, and we offer prayers of comfort to the family in this hour.
