Trophy Awards

Charles A. Holt, Jr., (Sonny) won two out of nine trophy awards at the Annual Shark Derby put on by the Gopher Flats Sportsman's Club on August 24. Sonny caught twenty-three fish, the largest number caught by any one person, and also caught the largest dog fish shark, an eight-pounder. This derby is held each year to keep down the number of shark, both because some kinds are a menace in the waters and because each one eats its own weight in fish each day, which depletes the fisherman's quarry.

The edible fish caught are given to welfare organizations and the non-edible ones are used to make fertilizer.

Sonny will be presented with his awards at a banquet of the club at Riverside Rancho on September 26. He is entering Santa Barbara State College this week, but will return home for this special occasion.
