Dr. Brainard Seriously Hurt

The multitude of friends of Dr. F. J. Brainard have been shocked to learn of his serious automobile accident last Friday at 8:30 p.m. He was returning from volunteering his services in giving free polio shots, a project of the Pacoima Jr. Women's Club, at the Health Center in Pacoima, and as Van Nuys Blvd. narrowed from four lanes to three just west of Laurel Canyon, a panel truck struck his car head-on. was thrown against the windshield which knocked him unconscious, and the protective steering wheel, according to his son Dr. E. L. Brainard of Woodland Hills, looked like a wilted leaf, but apparently saved his life. Upon reaching the Sun Valley Hospital he had partial-Ly regained consciousness but was in a state of shock. Examination revealed four lower jaw fractures, a splintered rib, splintered finger, multiple cuts and bruises, and a deep cut on his knee. He cannot lay down due to a previous throat surgery, and is still being fed intravenously. His jaw was wired in Surgery and will remain so for about six weeks, but it is hoped by the family that he will be brought home in a week or so. At present nurses around the clock tend to his needs.

Dr. Brainard donates his services often, to various organizations such as Boy Scouts, youth

Egremont School

WHERE CHILDREN LEARN BECAUSE THEY ARE HAPPY

September 16, 1958, marked a milestone in the history of Egremont, a French-English Day School. The second Egremont School opened at 19800 Devonshire, Chatsworth, amidst a three-acre lemon grove.

Egremont was founded in 1945 at Encino by Mrs. Margaret F. Bovee. She had one thought in mind, the preparation of children for adulthood through proper education at the elementary age level, the foundation years of learning. Mrs. Bovee's thoughts materialized to one basic idea - a child would have his feet planted firmly on the ground with his hopes and aspirations soaring as high as the sky. Thus the school colors were born, beige for the earth, and blue for the sky. The name Egremont was given in honor of Mrs. Bovee's father whose birthplace was Egremont, England.

Egremont Encino opened with 9 children, nursery age. Today, 13 years later, there are 200 students from nursery age level through the 8th grade. French is taught from nursery age through all grades. First graders are taught to read through phonics, spell, count, add, and subtract. Science is introduced in the First grade. There is a Junior and Senior choir. An athletic program is offered to both boys and girls, a program that will train not only the bodies but the minds towards good sportsmanship, fair play, and how to lose graciously. The principal theory is "It's not how well he plays the game, but win or lose, he trys his best". Thus Margaret F. Bovee's dream has been realized. Egremont Encino School today is

one of the highest scholastic schools in the state, and in contention nationwide. This little red schoolhouse perched on a five-acre knoll in Encino has progressed to all of Mrs. Margaret F. Bovee's expectations.

Egremont Chatsworth, two weeks ago opened its doors with the same policy as Egremont Encino. This pre-school of nursery, kindergarten, and pre-primer, will have the same hours as the Encino School, 8:45 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Transportation, lunch, and all supplies, are included in the tuition. The same standards, ideals, and trained teachers will prepare your child for the elementary level of education.

If your child is of the nursery age, 3-4 years, he will start immediately to learn French. will learn French songs, and the French names of the articles in his classroom. French is started in the nursery grade to help enunciation and English grammar. Oddly enough, a child from the age of one to five learns more during these years than any other time during his life span, and your child's mind is more receptive than any other time. Suddenly, for your three year old, this becomes a great big wide world to learn and investigate, and given the opportunity, he absorbs constantly. At Egremont Chatsworth, he will spend many hours outdoors, weather permitting, with new playground equipment. He will swim twice a week until it becomes too chilly, then he will start a sports program of playing ball and games

and be introduced to good sportsmanship and fair play by the Physical Education instructor.

Your child will be in a class with just 7 other children and will be supervised at all times. He will paint pictures for you and draw various animals, houses, and even his school chums. True, you may not recognize the picture, but your praise will make his effort worthwhile. For the first time in his so young life, he will make his break with his home. A pattern will be established. He will go to school for five hours a day. remaining hours will be spent with you, his parents, in his home. He will feel secure and loved both at home and school. Thus your nursery age child is learning the basic fundamentals of pre-school: adjustment, sharing with others, companionship, coordination, painting, drawing, rhythm and music, routine, security away from home, and good health habits.

Kindergarten is offered to children from the age of 42 to 5 years of age at Egremont Chatsworth. In many instances this is the age that your child first leaves home. is a most important step in the life of every child. If this kindergarten age child has not had nurssery school experience, he has been at home one to two years longer with his family. Thus leaving home for kindergarten may take a longer period of time for adjustment. this reason alone, kindergarten training is most important. It is not right or fair for a child to be deprived of kindergarten training for various reasons, then be expected to go into First grade without a period of adjustment from home, and the training that the Kindergarten level teaches. These little men and women, and they are little men and women, as this is their first experience of independence

from home, develop new emotions, curiosities, and habits at this age level, that prepares them for the basic foundations of learning in First grade - reading, writing, numbers, spelling, arithmetic, and phonics. It has been proved through the years that the first three elementary grades should teach the hasic foundations for higher Elementary, Junior, and Senior High School grades. Without this basic foundation training, any child will have difficulty learning.

Egremont builds a foundation in each child preparatory for First grade and future years. French is taught and finger painting is encouraged for self expression. Music through interpretive records and the piano teaches rhythm, balance, and comprehension. But most important of all, he learns security away from home through proper guidance and love.

Also at Egremont, a special class is held for the $5\frac{1}{2}$ to 6 year olds. This is called Pre-Primer. This group of children is taught Reading Readiness and Number Recognition. Phonics is introduced. Thus when a child enters First grade, he is better equipped and prepared for learning. French is continued and your child becomes eager to speak more rapidly and enunciate more clearly.

Director for both her new schools.






