
President Mrs. Glenn Beyer will preside and the program chairman, Mrs. Scott Bradley, will present the program numbers.


Mr.B.L. CORLENT of Tennessee is visiting for a couple of weeks with the Dicus's on Eton Avenue.

Funeral Services for EDWARD ROACH, who passed away Friday, were held Monday morning at the Lorenz Chapel with interment in Oakwood Cemetery. Dr. Harold Hayward was the officiating pastor. Mr. Roach had undergone surgery on Wednesday for a malignant stomach tumor and was apparently making a good recovery, when death suddenly took him on Friday. Mr. Roach was born in South Wales, England, in 1888, where he worked in the coal mines as a boy and young man to help his widowed mother raise her family. He made his home in America 35 yrs ago, and to Chatsworth about 11 years ago. He is survived by his wife Alice, to whom he was married 45 years; his only child, Lillian Schepler; three grandchildren, and many friends who share with the family their bereavement.

Getting out a paper is fun, but it's no picnic.


If we print jokes, people say we are silly. If we don't, they say we are too serious.
