## 50th Anniversary

The 50th Wedding Anniversary celebration of Mr. and Mrs. Chester Shadwick of Bloomington, pioneer residents of Chatsworth, was observed Sunday at their home, when tribute was paid to them by hundreds of their friends. All six of the Shadwick children, all married except one, were present with their families (thirteen grandchildren and one great grandchild.)

Mrs. Shadwick was the eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. N. A. Gray who came here about 1890. The Gray family moved to Pasadena for a few years when their children were ready for high school and college, as there was none here at that time. It was here that Mrs. Shadwick, then Sadie Gray, met, and in 1908 married, the man who was to be her companion these fifty years. In 1910 the Shadwicks came to Chatsworth to establish their home, living for a few years in the old Gray house now occupied by the Robert Werrens. They later had their own home, since destroyed by fire, on the ranch adjoining the present William McGinnis home. They lived here for 25 years when they moved to their present home.

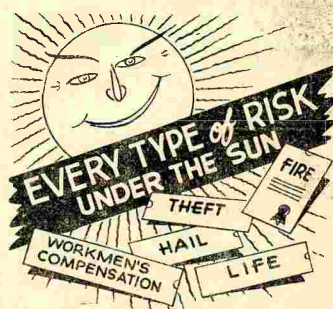

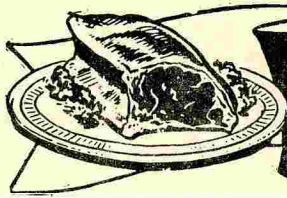

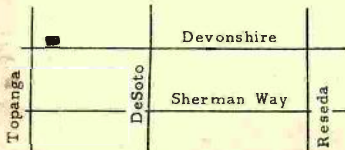
