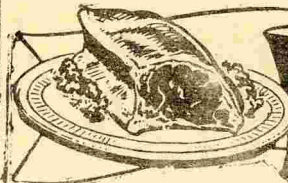

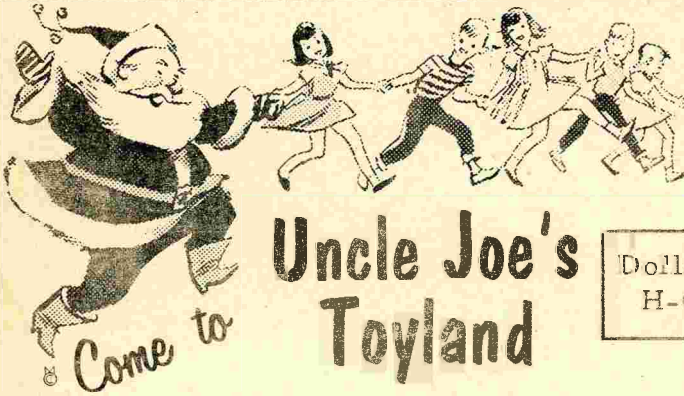

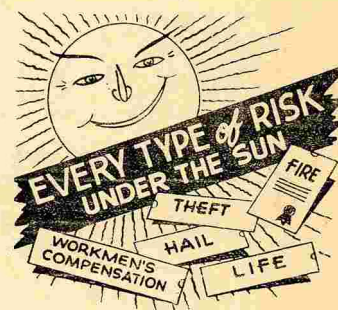

MARINER SCOUT SHIP

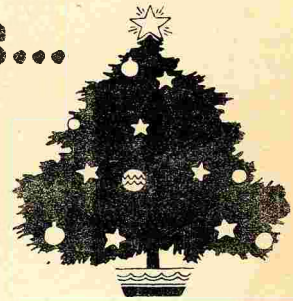

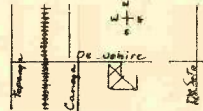

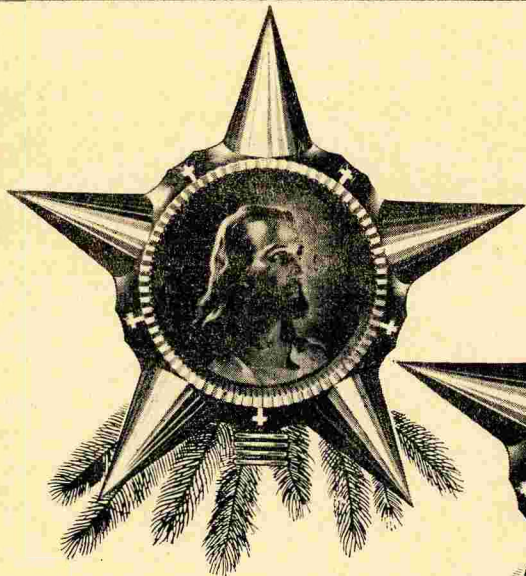
