

A junior and a senior high school, to cost a total of \$8,000,000, are PLANNED FOR THIS COMMUNITY according to Schools Supt. Ellis A. Jarvis. 



The CITY PLANNING COMMISSION will conduct a public hearing concerning the desirability of changing the zoning plan and building set-back line in the vicinity of the intersection of Lassen Street and DeSoto Avenue. An application has been filed requesting that the present A2 Agricultural Zone (two-acre lot area) be changed to the C2 Commercial Zone, P Automobile Parking Zone and the R3 Multiple Dwelling Zone on a 17.7 acre parcel of land on the north side of Lassen Street from DeSoto Avenue to Lurline Avenue. excluding a 150 x 150 foot parcel at the northeastern corner of Lassen and DeSoto which is now in the C2 zone. The P Zone is requested on the north side of Lassen beginning 150 feet east of DeSoto and extending easterly for a distance of 690 feet, to a depth of 265 feet; also on the east side of DeSoto beginning 150 feet north of Lassen and extending northerly for 115 feet, to a depth of 150 feet, and on the east side of DeSoto for 170 feet


