## Dedication Service

A highlight of the program was the presentation of the flag to Postmaster Jennings, which was obtained for the new building by Congressman Hiestand. The letter from the Congressman states that the flag has flown over the capitol of the United States.

Postmaster T. Polk Jennings expressed his deep appreciation to all organizations and individuals who had a part in making plans for the dedication.

The dedicatory address was given by Spire Rafalovich, Distribution and Traffic Manager for the San Francisco Postal Region, and it was both informative and interesting as he gave facts and statistics regarding the marvelous growth of the postal business in the United States, and of the many new modern mechanical improvements being used to improve the service.

Safe Driving awards were presented by William France, assistant to the postmaster, to Leonard Lux and Henry, two year awards, and to Harry Smith, a one year award, the nation's highest award for safe driving.

Refreshments were served following the ceremony, and guests were invited to inspect the facility.

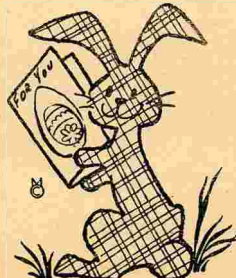
ELWOOD PICKERING, who recently underwent major surgery, is reported to be getting around again following his convalescence.

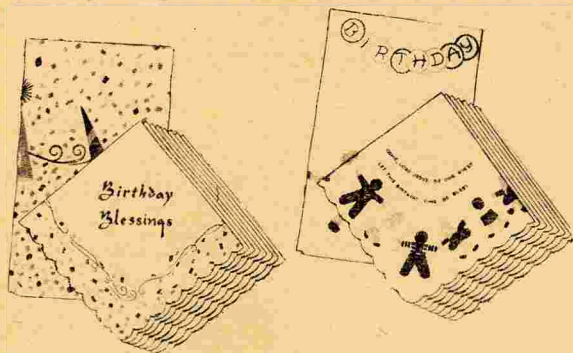
