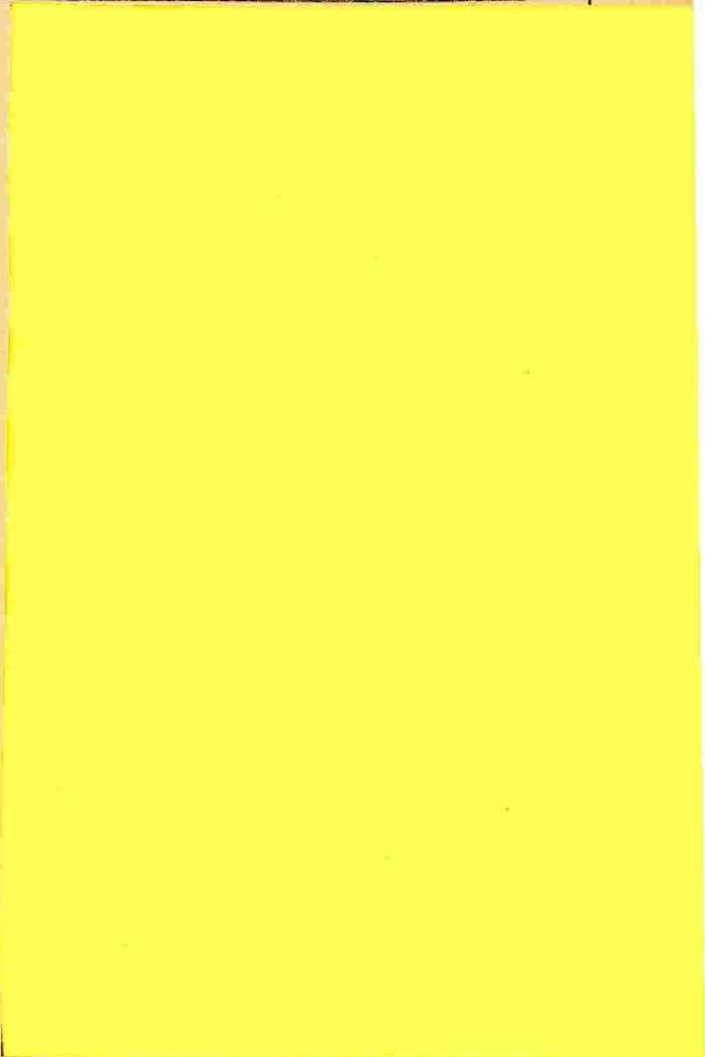

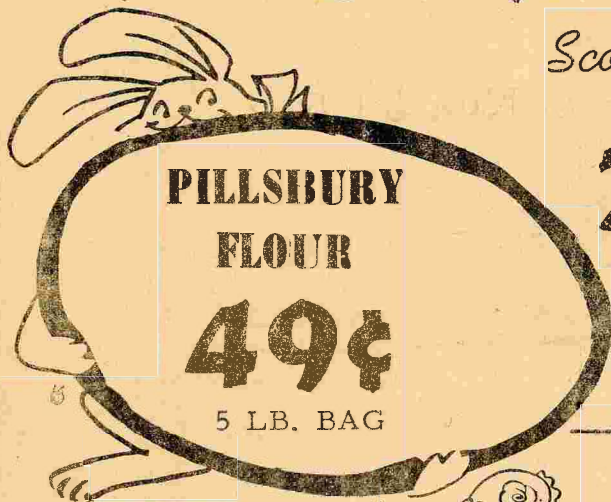

A new approach to CONSUMER CREDIT is being initiated by Security First National Bank, David A. Latham, Manager of our local branch, announced today. The plan, called "Custom Credit", includes many of the benefits of both an installment loan and a checking account. Under the new plan the consumer applies for credit which, upon approval, may be used as he elects simply by writing a check. In effect he borrows against his loan as he needs money, and with no trips back to the bank. The bank will bill the customer monthly, calling for payments commensurate with the amount of credit in use.

The program, which is unique in California banking, allows the user to buy for cash where he chooses and when he chooses, to his maximum personal advantage. He does this through the use of economical bank credit.

In explaining the plan, Latham said, "Basic economic questions answered by this approach to consumer credit are even more important than its unique service value to the individual family. We feel that the numerous forms of credit that are being offered the consumer today are involving a growing

number of families in a complex web of obligations. Family budgeting becomes ever more difficult. Our objective is to assist families in managing their financial affairs by establishing for them simple 'lines of credit'. This approach is not fundamentally different from the type of bank credit long employed by industry."

"Our philosophy, in brief, is to do all we can to help the customer become master of his own money. We want him to be a free agent when he is shopping and we seek to simplify the managing of the family budget."

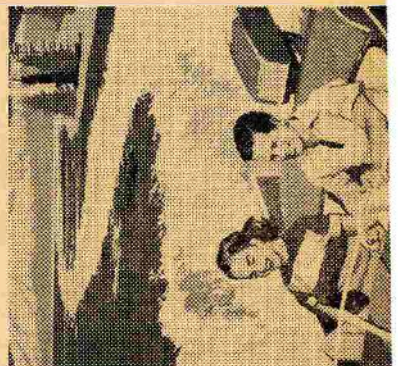
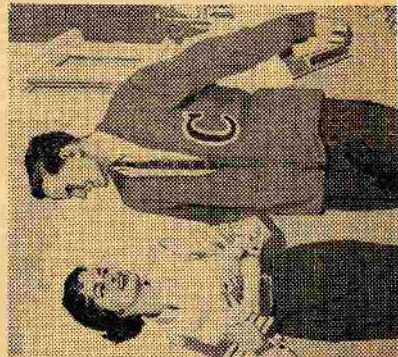

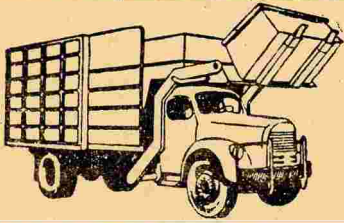
