



The book, "Treasure of the High Country", continues the story of the Marriner family made famous in his last children's book, "The Mustangers". His first children's book, "The Ordeal of the Young Hunter", received national honor as being one of the two best books for children selected by the Child's Study Association of America for the year 1954. Mr. Lauritzen has just signed a contract to write a fourth child's book.
