A LETTER TO YOU FROM DR. THOMAS A. NEWLAND, CHAIRMAN MEMBERSHIP COMM. OF CHATSWOIRTH CHAMBER OF COMMERCE Dear People of Chatsworth:

On Tuesday, April 14, the Chatsworth Chamber of Commerce reversed its previous stand on a dump in the Santa Susana Fass area. There was a vote of 15-10 in favor of having a dump in this area. The subject of the dump is not the purpose of this letter. The purpose is to jar loose an additional 80 odd members of the Chamber to attend meetings and have a more repuresentative vote on matter's of this nature. 


