"WEAR A POPPY". This is the appeal which will greet Chatsworth citizens on the morning of May 22 from the American Legion Auxiliary volunteers. On that day everyone will be asked to wear a poppy as a personal tribute to America's war dead.

"Wearing a POPPY on POPPY DAY is the way to show that we remember and are grateful to those who gave their lives in our country's defense", said Mrs. Tom Samerille, the Auxiliary's POP-PY DAY chairman. "It is an individual gesture of devotion to the cause in which they died--the cause of free America".

A corps of volunteers has been organized to distribute the Memorial flowers in all parts of the city on May 22 and 23. These volunteer workers will receive contributions for the Auxiliary's work in behalf of disabled war veterans and needy children of veterans. These poppies have been made by disabled veterans in San Fernando Veterans Hospital, and they have been paid for each poppy they make.







Eight students from Egremont Encino will be inducted into the "Marvee" chapter, and five students from Egremont Costa Mesa will be inducted into the "Bovmont" chapter. The 7th and 8th grade student body from both schools selected the names of their chapters in honor of the late Mrs. Margaret F. Bovee, founder and owner of Egremont. Mrs. Marion H. Burbridge, Director of the Egremont Schools, will preside at the ceremony. She will introduce the following guests: Mr. Vern Simpson, owner and director of Montclair College Preparatory School Tarzana. Mr. Simpson will be the
