Eduardo Zamora was the unfortunate victim last Sunday afternoon. He was travelling east on Chatsworth Street, and a train travelling south evidently was not heard by him as he approached the tracks. The front end of his '51 Cadillac was demolished as the front end of the train struck it.

Mr. Zamora was a resident of La Puente, and has done gardening for several prominent Chatsworth residents for several years. He was hard working, conscientious, and a care driver, according to those who knew him. He leaves his wife, Mae; a sister, Carmen, of Chatsworth; two sisters in Los Angeles, Frances and Mela; and a brother, Bernardini, stationed at Ford, who met the Ed Crossis trying to locate.

Mr. Zamora was born in Colorado in 1915, and first came to Calif as an Army paratrooper, later coming to live in 1941. Our sympathy is extended to the family in this tragic loss of their loved one.

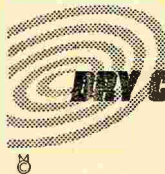

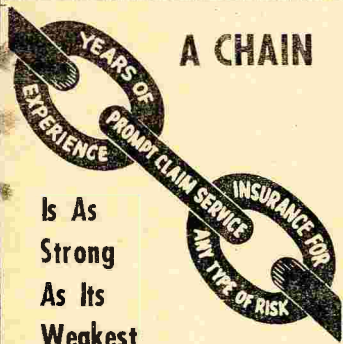
