Following its sensationally successful presentation of BUS STOP, the third offering of the season at The Chatsworth Summer Theatre is OUR TOWN by Thornton Wilder, beginning this Friday evening at 8:30 p.m. The play will be repeated on Saturday, August 8, and also Friday and Saturday of next week (reservations and information can be had by phoning DI 1-1448).

"Our Town" is a Pulitzer Prize Winner and one of the great plays of our day, presenting with gentle humor, simplicity, sincerity, beauty, and compassionate understanding the life of any small town and its inhabitants -- whether it is called Grovers Corners, New Hampshire, or Chatsworth, California -- from the cradle to the grave. A real adventure in playgoing, it is a must for those who have never seen it; those who have seen it will want to come again!

Milton Parsons directs and also plays Simon Stimson, the church choir leader, which he played in New York and on the road with Frank Craven and Dorothy McGuire,

and in the West Coast production with Martha Scott.

Heading the large cast is Tom Fadden, the Howie Newsome of the original Broadway company, as the Stage Manager. Tom is a familiar figure to TV viewers as Silas Perry,

the storekeeper in Cimarron City. He has recently completed two films, "Satan's Breakfast" and Walt Disney's "Toby Tyler". Presently living in Santa Monica, he is a former resident of Tarzana where he is remembered as the organizer of the West Valley Chamber of Commerce Soft Ball League in 1945.

Versatile Gladys Richards, already a favorite with Chatsworth Theatre audiences for her delightfully amusing and appealing portrayal of the "chantoosey" from the Ozarks in BUS STOP, will exhibit another facet of her talent with her homespun characterization of Mrs. Webb. Mrs. Gibbs will be played by Yvonne White, well-known Hollywood actress and dramatic coach. Clarence Straight (seen previously as Blessington in SOLID GOLD CADILLAC) is Howie Newsome, the milkman.

Sally Ann Parsons fulfills a lifetime ambition by playing the role of Emily Webb, and is especially happy that her godmother, Teresa Wright, one of the original (please turn to pg. 8)
