

Lutheran Church Groundbreaking

The new structure to be erected, sketched above, was designed by Mr. Dennis Wehmueller, architect of Los Angeles, and will comprise the first unit of the church plant. Other buildings will be added as the congregation grows. A day school is also proposed for the future. The first unit to be constructed soon will have a seating capacity of over 400, and will include six class rooms for the Sunday School plus the Nave of the church. The public is cordially invited to come and to participate in this groundbreaking service.


