## ZONING DISCUSSION


Culminating months of research and study, the zoning committee of the Chatsworth Chamber of Commerce will have its recommendations for the community's master plan available for public discussion at the next meeting of the Chamber on Tuesday, September 8, 8:00 p.m., at Chatsworth Center, 10332 Santa Susana Avenue. This was announced by Harlin Curtis, Chamber president, and Jay Boyce, chairman of the Chamber's zoning committee, who urge local residents to attend the meeting and view the proposed land use map.

Boyce strongly stressed his committee's opposition to commercial zoning scattered throughout the residential districts. "We want to keep Chatsworth a desirable residential community with commercial zoning limited to a large centrally located four square block area with ample parking facilities", Boyce said.

"In addition to residential and commercial acreage, we feel that a certain amount of zoning for the right type of light industries is necessary for the development of a well balanced community." He referred to Chatsworth's phenomenal

population growth which he said jumped from 7500 in 1958 to its present total of 15,000. "We have made every effort to propose the proper type of zoning to accommodate the community's continued growth," Boyce (please turn to page 14)
