CHAMBER MEETING

The Chatsworth Chamber of Commerce presented a proposed master plan to the public at Tuesday's meeting, which was attended by about 100 residents and several non-resident land owners.

Jay Boyce, chairman of the zoning committee, says the proposed Master Plan will make some of the speculative land owners unhappy; other land owners will not only enjoy a greater return on their investment but will be able to contribute to the orderly growth of Chatsworth. The home owners who hold the greatest stake in the future of Chatsworth, and without whom commerce and industry cannot flourish, are protected by the Master Plan according to Mr. Boyce.

The Master Plan outlines the boundaries of approximately 1600 acres reserved for manufacturing; approximately 200 acres for commercial use; a generous area for multiple dwellings and well defined residential areas necessary to house the 60,000 additional residents predicted for the next ten years.

The Planning and Zoning Committee solicits the comments and suggestions of all those interested in making Chatsworth a fine place to live, to shop, and to work.

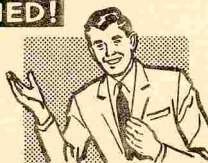

Dr. William Hildebrand, the Pasadena District Superintendent, filled the pulpit for Rev. Neal on Sunday.

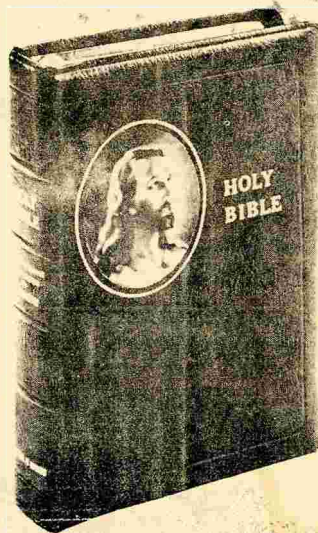
