Another gala Halloween Festival is planned for the pre-school and school age children at Orcutt Park, and is being coordinated by the Canoga Park Community Council.

Festival activities planned include costume parade, costume judging, game booths of all kinds, field games, greased pole, refreshments, teen-age dance, decoration of the club house, fortune telling, and "beat the wreck".

Capistrano PTA, Chatsworth PTA, and Kiwanis have volunteered to work on booths and refreshments. Dick Newman has volunteered to paint additional signs required to advertise the booths.

Many organizations have promised to discuss at their meetings what efforts they can contribute to the success of the festival. It has been pointed out that the festival needs more workers than ever before, with the many additional residents in the area.

In the past, local organizations have contributed a total of \$300 to defray expenses of the festival and have arranged for volunteers for the booths. If (please turn to pg. 4)

RED FEATHER CAMPAIGN

Pooling their efforts to raise \$1,643 for Chatsworth's portion of the Valley's 1959 Community Chest goal of \$222,250 are local volunteer workers. "Red Feather agencies served 259 residents in Chatsworth the first six months of this year. The only way we can repay the 165 agencies is to raise money for their operating expenses", George A. Burns, Valley area chairman, said.

"Chest funds are efficiently raised and intelligently spent", Burns said. He pointed out that the total cost of the campaign is only 8.9 percent, lower than any other campaign of similar size in Los Angeles.

Dave Latham of the Security-First National Bank is our city chairman, and he tells us "to keep pace with the growing Valley population and the Chest services, which are needed and used by Valley people, we must support this appeal. Remember, 80 cents out of every Chest dollar is spent for children."

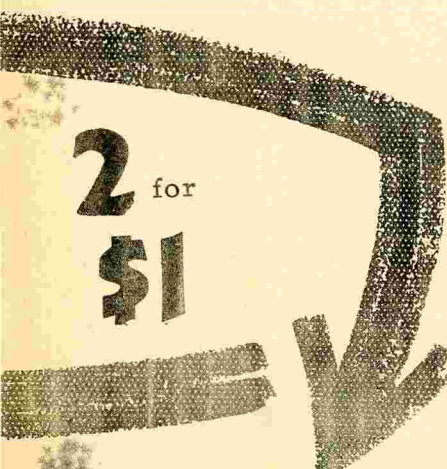
