MORE BREAK-INS


Two more store robberies in the past week should keep us all alert to the new wave of breakins around town.

Last Wednesday night Sutherland's Cleaners at 10240 Topanga Ganyon Blvd. was broken into, supposedly by juveniles, who enered through a rear transom window. About \$20 was taken from the cash register, two loaded revolvers from a desk drawer, an electric razor, diamond set Elks pin, an \$85 wrist watch, and a few items of customers' clothing.

And then on Saturday or Sunday night a more professional job was done at Neighborhood TV, 21808 Devonshire, when a haul was made f about \$2,000 worth of merchandise -- 4 TV sets, 12 radios, 4 record players, 3 stereo speakers, clock radios, and a number of items which had been left for repair. The cash register (no money) and adding machine were also taken. No fingerprints were found; all electric plugs were pulled to darken the store front; a large cardboard box with trash was emptied on the floor.
