Two outstanding Chatsworth citizens left our midst this past weekend when this life was left behind and a new life in eternity begun.

Judge DAVID FULWIDER passed away Friday evening as the result of a chronic heart ailment. Funeral services were held Tuesday evening at 7:30 at the Lorenzen Chapel in Reseda, with private interment in Oalswood the following morning.

The story of Judge Fulwider's life and of his service in his chosen profession will appear in next week's issue.

WALTER P. LOHMAN, long-time Chatsworth Real Estate broker, passed away at his Owensmouth Ave. home last Saturday morning, after living a very active and full life, enjoying every minute of it and living it to its fullest. He scarcely knew sickness until his recent illness commenced September

He was born in St. Louis, Mo., on August 14, 1882, and came to Los Angeles in 1904. In his younger years he was the organizer of two banks in the Middle West, instrumental in the formation of Stocks and Bonds Companies, and was responsible for the construction of a bridge and a church with his sales of stock. He was in the Real Estate business for the past 40 years, 25 years of

which he handled insurance for New England Mutual Life.

At one time he was a rather well-known amateur golfer, and proudly displayed his trophies at his home.

Besides his many, many friends who will miss seeing him about town, he leaves a daughter, Mary Louise Lewis (near San Diego); a daughter, Loxi Lohman, and son Young Walter Lohman.

Memorial services were held at the First Baptist Church on Monday, at which Rev. Charles T. Hughes of the local church, and Dr. Alger W. Geary, Executive Secretary of the Los Angeles Baptist City Mission Society, shared in officiating. Interment followed at Oakwood Cemetery.





SOUTH SEA TRIP:

Mr. and Mrs. Scott Bradley recently returned from a six and one half week trip to the South Seas, an outstanding event in their busy, eventful lives. The following is their personal account of the trip, However, the Mormon missionaries in brief, written by Mrs. Bradley.

"Leaving Wilmington on a Palatial Cruise Ship, we enjoyed seven full days at sea with captain's parties, bridge parties, canasta parties, cabaret shows, picture shows, hat contests, costume contests, church services, orchestra concerts, swimming, gymmastics and almost every kind of entertainment and recreation one could name.

"We finally arrived at Papeete, the capitol of Tahiti, where the picture "South Pacific" was filmed, and saw its sister Island, Moorea Bali Hi, which is in the same film. The women aboard rushed to the shops to have dresses

made of the gay native prints and to buy hand-carved mother-of-pearl jewelry and other articles. The k sland is a French Protectorate and the schools are under the direction of the Catholic Church. However, the Mormon missionaries are also very active in all this region and brought groups of their converts aboard ship to dance and sing their lovely native music for us. We saw Sterling Hayden's yacht moored alongside the one modern warship which constitutes the entire Tahitian Navy.

I'm afraid the white race has taken advantage of the "Dolce Far Niete" beauty of the native life, and neglected the discipline and takes which kept it clean and wholesome." (this article will be


