According to Mrs. Scott, the majority of the PTAs in the Valley are participating in welfare activity outside their own needs. Student body assistance and youth group cooperation are assisting the parent-teacher groups in making their welfare gifts.

to Chris Wangsgard at the last meeting.

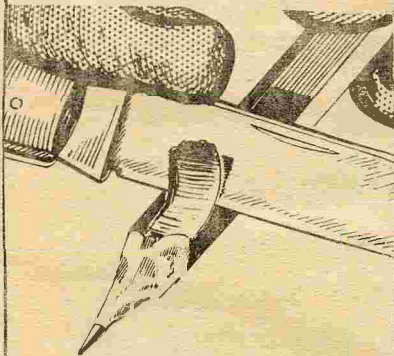
Cubmaster Curth Myhre has found it necessary to resign, and until a new cubmaster is appointed John Farrell, assistant cubmaster, is carrying on the work.

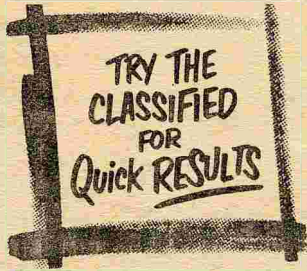
