The recent children's book by JON REED LAURITZEN, local author of note, was given a nice review in the book section of the L. A. Times Sunday. "Treasure of High Country" takes place near the Arizona frontier where high mountains and Indian legends abound. "The author has a ranch near the setting of the story and has used actual local lore to test his character's fortitude and cleverness. The tolerance the Mariner children displayed for an ugly old man pays off when he befriends their little sister and protects her from the bad men. Action, suspense, and bravery of pioneer boys are the essential ingredients of this compelling, dramatic story."

The book has been read by this reporter, who would like to add that in addition to his unique ability as a story-teller, Mr. Lauritzen has a marvelous power of description, and the manner in which he tells of the "high country" is most intriguing.

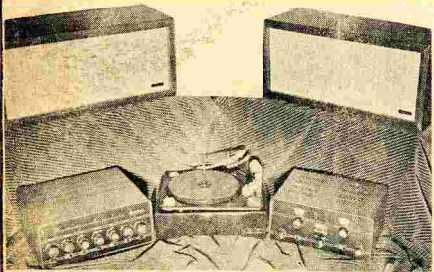
Scenery and costuming was outstanding, and in all the entire production was very beautiful and well done.

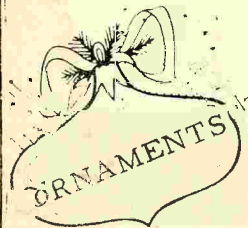
