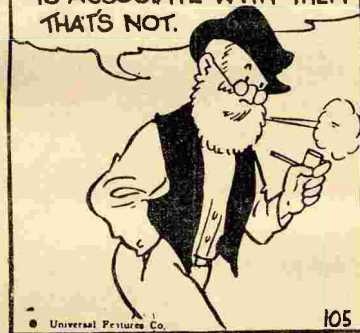

Chatsworth has a most illustrious citizen whose activities keep him travelling to all parts of the world, and because he is so busy it is difficult to find him at home long enough to learn about the interesting things he does. This man is Bill Henry of the "By the Way" column for the L.A. Times, reporter and news commentator of high standing.

Mr. Henry has flown 60,000 miles this past year to many countries of the world. His last trip alone, on which he accompanied President Eisenhower on his goodwill tour, totalled 23,000 miles as they visited 11 countries. He started last year with a trip to Florida, followed by one to Bermuda. During the summer he was in Canada, and in September accompanied the president and his party to England, France, and Germany. Between these journeys his job as director for the radio and TV coverage for the Democratic and Republican Conventions has required several trips to Chicago and Los Angeles. He is also a director for the Olympic Games and has been called to Squaw Valley several times for consultations. In addition to this he has made many cross-country trips from his business home in Washington D.C., to his country home in Chatsworth.

Mr. Henry finds his trips very interesting because of the people he meets and the reactions of the crowds of people in various countries. But they are wearisome too, as there is little time for sleep and rest except on the airplanes. Here, he can relax and enjoy good American food.

When this reporter talked to him about the controversial reports regarding the success of President Eisenhower's last trip, Mr. Henry stated that first, one should determine why the trip was made. He gave three reasons. First, in many countries there has been strong Communistic propoganda against the "dirty capitalistic system of America" and the trip was very succesful in destroying this illusion built up by the Russians. It was also very valuable in creating a new image of America as a peace-loving country which has never fought a war of aggression to take away the lands of any peoples. The second object of the trip was to strengthen the hands of the leaders of other governments in the knowledge that there is no softening in the attitude of our president toward Russia propoganda and Communistic (please turn to page 6)

 infiltration. The third object was to force local agents and governments to publicize the fact that the many benefits which have come to their countries were the direct result of the generosity of the U. S.

Since the trip was made to accomplish the above objectives and not to settle any world problems, Mr. Henry considers it very successful, and the president became to the peoples of the various countries he visited the symbol of a peace-loving country with a spirit of goodwill to people of all nations.

At the conclusion of the interview, Mr. Henry stated that he was glad to be home. "You can have all if it", he added, "I'll take Chatsworth."

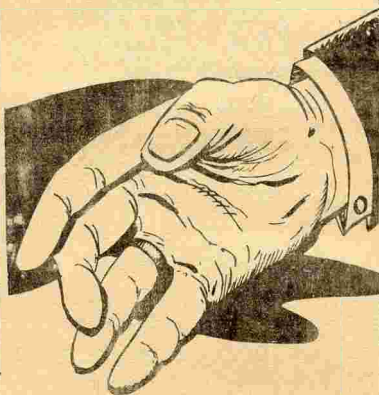
