

This charming little story, written in verse, is told in the first person by Becky, one of Lionel Barrymore's twenty-two cats, and can be read with equal enjoyment by both young and old.

At Miss Wheeler's request, 50% of the royalties from the sale of the books will go to The Mation Picture Country House and Hospital in Woodland Hills in memory of Mr. Barrymore. The script of the story was completed before Mr. Barrymore's death, with he himself making the clever illustrations, and Miss Wheeler dedicated the book to him. In addition to his fame as a stage, screen, radio and TV star, Mr. Barrymore was a former Honorary Mayor of Chatsworth.

Miss Wheeler has two other books ready for publication. The first, "Leaning on the Wind", a biography of Richard Frances Burton, the climax of ten years of research, will be published this spring. The second, "Miss Hobson's Choice", a hum-

orous novel, will be printed in the Fall.

Other books which Miss Wheeler has written are "The Riddle of the Eighth Guest", a mystery novel, and 'My Brother was Mozart", a biography of Mozart. Both of these books were written in collaboration, and the last one received the first prize of \$2,000 from the Elizabeth Elswirth Foundation in this classification.

Two other of her books are "Past Thirty", a novel, and "Merely a Matter of Form", a book on diet.

Miss Wheeler was born in Minnesota but spent many years in Canada. It is here that she began her writing career as a feature writer and woman's page editor for "The Leader Post" in Saskatchewan. Prior to coming to Chatsworth, she worked for two years on one of the local papers in Tujunga. Her many Chatsworth friends wish her every success with her new books.
