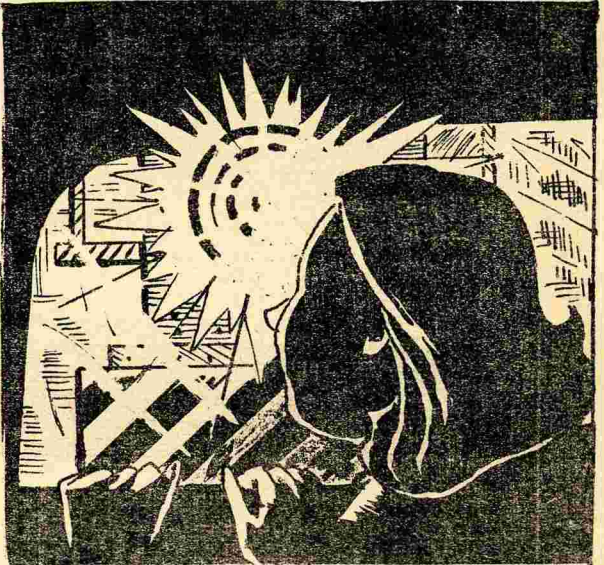
Nuptials

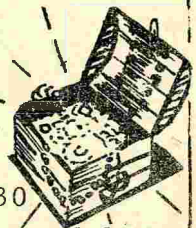
This Saturday will be a "work day" at the church site - construction of the new church edifice at Devonshire and Mason is progressing rapidly.
