Goal for the San Fernando Valley in the March Red Cross fund campaign is \$162,200, with \$109,928 to be solicited in residential areas and \$52,272 from commerce and industry and local businesses, according to Bjarne Larsen, fund campaign chairman. Quota for Chatsworth is \$1,000.

Bill Henry at Olympics

Bill Henry, local resident who has won for himself an enviable record in the vast world of communications through the years, added another laurel to his already distinguished list of attainments at the recent Winter Olympics at Squaw Valley.

Mr. Henry was a member of the original planning committee, was chairman of the radio-TV and press committee, the pageantry committee (working with Walt Disney), and ended up by announcing the opening and closing, and victory sessions of the events. Only those on the "inside" will ever know the detail of preliminary planning, housing, transportation, entertainment, and the thousand and one intraccies of such an event.

To Mr. Herry, the big hit of the opening ceremonies was the presence of 4,000 school children from Califand Nev., who participated with their bands and choral groups. These children raised their own money for the trip, making it a completely voluntary service. A troop of Explorer Scouts from Lake Tahoe gave valuable service in the flag raising ceremonies, and in protecting them from "souvenir snatchers". The President's own band, the U.S. Marine Band, was there for the entire time.

Mr. Henry believes it to be the finest winter Olympics ever shown

anywhere. A very unusual situation was the sharing of the gold medal awards by 12 nations, an equalization bringing about a happy spirit.





Announcement has been received by many friends of the marriage of Mrs. Lucy Wintz to Dr. James Stratford Allen on February 1 in Las Vegas.


