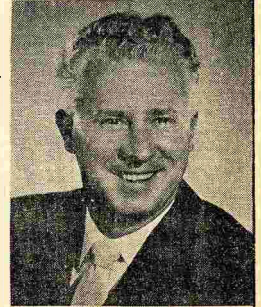
"Belles and Bonnets" is the theme of the show and fashions are by our own Colleen's of Chatsworth.

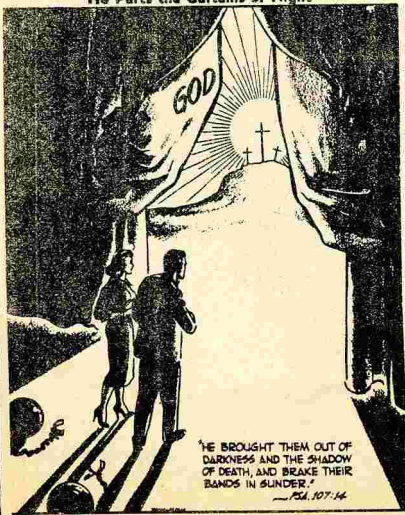
