## Escape Blaze

Mr. and Mrs. Duane Nowlin and baby daughter narrowly escaped being overcome by smoke and flames which destroyed their home and belongings at Chatsworth Lake early last Wednesday morning. Duane's parents saw the blaze and in entering the house had difficulty arousing the couple, who in sleep had already become partially overcome by the smoke. The fire was blamed on an overheated stove.

## Train Blockade

Two of five boys who admitted putting a blockade in the path of a train on the S.P. tracks at the entrance of the Stony Point tunnel were committed to Juvenile Hall recently, the other three being released to their parents pending a hearing in Juvenile Court. Two large boulders and a large telephone pole made the blockade and endangered the lives of 50 people aboard. Fortunately it was seen before any damage was done, and the mail and express train continued to Los Angeles after the removal of the obstruction.

According to the usual police procedure, the names of the juveniles were not made public, but it is reported that they are from this vicinity. If this is the case it would belie the excuse of the boys, who said they were under the impression that the railroad was abandoned.

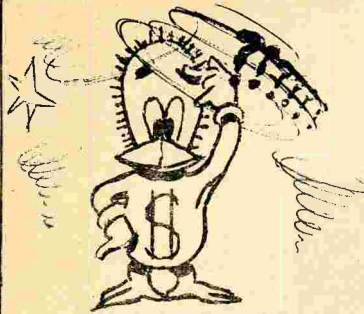
This meeting will also honor all of the year's new members as special guests.

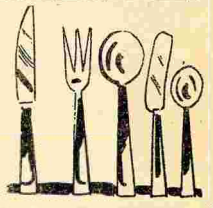
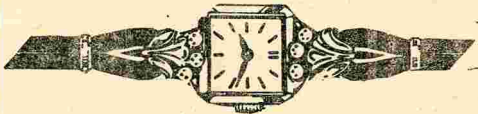

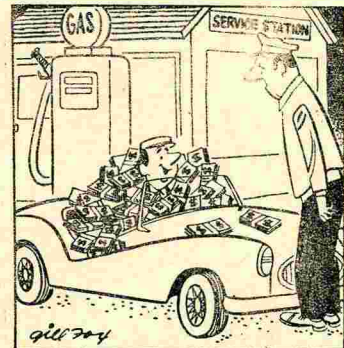
