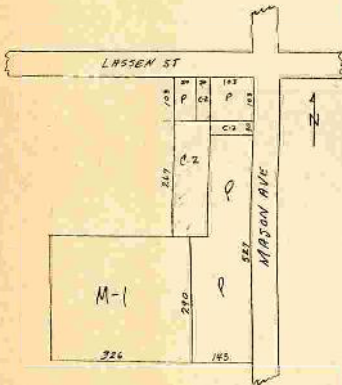
**BE SMART LOOK SMART Have it DRY CLEANED**

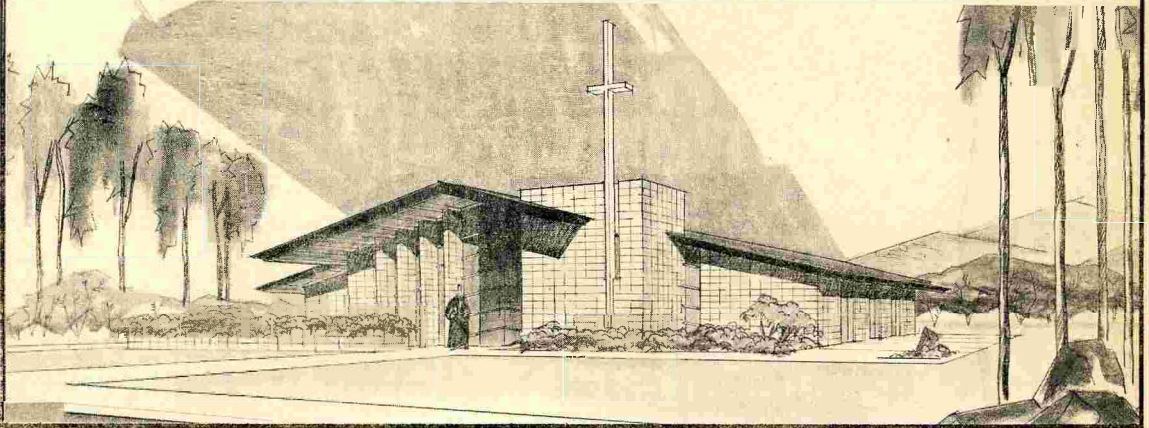
