54th WEDDING ANNIVERSARY

September 28 was the 54th Wedding Anniversary of Eve and Bob Boggis, a charter member of our Club. When they were married Bob was manager of a branch of the National Refining Co., and was later transferred to the head office in Cleveland

where he specialized in the lubrication of coal mining machinery. He spent 18 years there before going into the metal stamping business, from which he then retired, and moved to Chatsworth in 1945 in order to be with his son William, now deceased.

Bob and Eve have two daughters both living here in Chatsworth. Bob and Eve were two of the seven Episcopal members who founded St. Martin's in the Fields in Canoga Park, now one of the largest parishes in the Diocese of the Protestant Episcopal Church of Southern California. Bob was honored with a Life Membership in the Chatsworth Chamber of Commerce.

Bob is a philatelist and numismatist. (To save you running to the dictionary of your Editor did — translated that means stamp collector and coin collector!) Bob lived in Washington D. C. until he was 21, and at that time attended the same school as the sons of President Theodore Roosevelt and traded stamps with them at the White House.

Bob also has a personal interest in American History. His father, Major James H. Boggis was Adjutant of Fuller's Ohio Brigade in the Civil War and is buried at Arlington National Cemetery. Bob was made an honorary member of this Brigade. Bob was the Secretary and Treasurer of the Western Reserve Society of the Sons of the American Revolution for 27 years at Cleveland, Ohio, and was Vice-President General of the National Society for one year.
