## THE VISA PROGRAM

Dr. George Lorbeer, committeeman for International Students, attended the District VISA Conference on September 19, and reports to us: The main purpose of the VISA program is to get foreign students who are studying in America to learn how Americans really live. They can not do this by staying in school dormitories, working in school libraries, and attending school classes.

The real American can not be learned by reading the papers, watching television, or an occasional trip to commercial recreation and play centers.

Where is the "real America"? It is in the homes and hearts of the American family! In order that foreign students learn how we really think it becomes mandatory that we get the students away from the confines of the schools walls and into the homes and the community.

In order to do this the VISA program by local Rotary Clubs in California was established. VISA in Rotary means Visiting International Students' Activities.

In order to foster International Service and improvement of world understanding by interest in International Students, and while doing so, provide Clubs, the families of Rotarians, and their communities with a program that would bring close personal contact with students from other lands. Ten disricts of California and Northern Nevada have now incorportted to help promote the program.

The VISA program is basically for the undergraduate student. Rotary Foundation is for the graduate student. Consequently there is no conflict of interest.

What our club hopes to do is: 1. We are contacting the local schools to survey prospective foreign students. 2. We will ask for volunteers to host several students for a week-end, evening or holiday at their mutual convenience. 3. We hope that we may have one or more students visit us for a luncheon meeting during the year so that we can learn about them as well as teach them something about us.

There are 60,000 foreign students in the United States today. What a golden opportunity we have of showing them America! Will you help?
