### THE WEEK THAT WAS

Tom Craig, Director of International Service, told about our donation to CARE and our shipment of clothing to Equador. Wes Nordfelt mentioned the shipping of goats to Equador through the help of our Rotary Club. Harold Allen is planning to take pictures of each Rotarian at his home and business establishment and will send them to our sister club in Norway. George Lorbeer is looking into the possibility of getting some old textbooks from the schools to ship to India. Bruce Pegg brought up the idea of adopting an orphan at a cost of \$15 a month to the club.

John McNamee, Director of Vocational Service, has brought several high school boys to our meetings this year so that they will learn more about Rotary. John and Clarence Palmer have been working hard at getting the Four Way Test put in non-Rotarian's places of business.

Nick Petruso, Director of Community Service, mentioned some of the things our Club has done this year for the community: The trophy for the best citizen and athlete at the Chatsworth High School; the 1500 orchids that were passed out by Rotarians and their children at the Chatsworth parade; the 250 American flags passed out on the 4th of July; the mouth-to-mouth recessitation; the Rotary Club luncheon at Hughes Market which raised money so that our club could donate \$250 to the Chatsworth Park; and a thanks to Doug and Clarence Palmer for the coolers that they donated to the Chatsworth Center Building and our Rotary Club paid most of the expense of having them installed; our donations to Rancho San Antonio; our Blood bank; Ted Todd's collection for the United Way; and our club's donation to the muscular dystrophy campaign. In the future Mike Ragusin is planning a rodeo, our club is thinking about sponsoring a Little League Baseball Team, and Mert Cooke is planning a Bar-B-Que at Chatsworth Park.

So, with what we have done and have planned for the future it looks like the greatest year ever for the Chatsworth Rotary Club.

President Clif pointed out that we have not yet had 100 per cent attendance for a month so far this year. Clif says that this is the month -- try the buddy system -- telephone, or what have you -- but lets have 100 per cent for January.

Lucky Mert Cooke won the five dollars, and Doug Palmer won back his own \$3 donation for second prize, which he donated to the club. Clif put in a dollar per cylinder for his new car. Mike Hayes paid five bucks for getting Curly out of bed in the wee hours of the morning. Doug had as his guest former President Oran Wells, now living in Crescent City.

Dean Beisner, Treasurer, announced that dues are now due for

those who do not pay yearly.

# GOVERNOR NOMINEE FOR 1965-66

Governor Leon Edgar, in his monthly letter, introduced the Governor Nominee for 1965-66, District 526, William (Bill) H. Godbey,

a member of the Crescenta Canada Rotary Club.

Bill Godbey attended John Marshall High School in Los Angeles and Occidental College -- entered the U. S. Navy Cadet Program in 1942 and graduated as a 2nd Lieutenant in the U. S. Marine Corps in 1943. He saw action during World War II at Guadalcanal, Russel islands, Munda, Bougainville, and the Green islands -- Participated in the great aerial battles between the Japanese Air Force and the United States Air Forces over Rabal.

Bill left the Marine Corps in 1946, and entered business with his father and brother in the construction and land development field.

Bill joined Rotary in March, 1954. He has served Rotary as: President of his Club, Chairmen of the Business Management Conference, Chairman of the District Rotary Foundation, Chairman of the District International Service Committee, and Chairman of the Youth Exchange Committee.
